Learning Objectives:

• Learn to assess the reliability of different types of documents.

• Consider the difference between the life of an officer and regular solider.

• Understand why there are inconsistencies in the way news was reported depending on the creator and recipient.

• Discover how propaganda was used to recruit more people to the war effort.

15 mins	Inconsistences in reporting news	Look into treatment/injuries and dealing with death of a solider, using Philip Hewetson's death as an example.	Objects, question sheets	Small groups

10 mins	Propaganda	Look at the different postcards and discuss how they were used for propaganda. Consider the text, the images, different icons.	Facsimiles of postcards	Small groups
