Learning Objectives:

- Learn to assess the reliability of different types of documents.
- Consider the difference between the life of an officer and regular soldier.
- Understand why there are inconsistencies in the way news was reported depending on the creator and recipient.
- Discover how propaganda was used to recruit more people to the war effort.

40 mins	Comparison of life of an officer and a regular soldier	<p>Compare the stories of Frank Dunham and Philip Heweston, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • joining up • training • arriving at the front • everyday life in the trenches <p>Research skills- need to think about date of letter/ diary entry, their role at the time</p> <p>Using this information consider-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The language they used • Their feelings/ attitudes to the war • Any positives/ negatives they mention 	Facsimiles of the letters/ diaries	pairs

15 mins	Inconsistences in reporting news	<p>Look into treatment/injuries and dealing with death of a soldier, using Philip Hewetson's death as an example.</p> <p>Letter from Philip's fellow officers after he was reported missing</p> <p>Letter from German hospital about Philip's death</p> <p>Entries from the Norfolk War Hospital magazine</p> <p>Consider why they were written, who by and the different styles.</p>	Objects, question sheets	Small groups
10 mins	Propaganda	Look at the different postcards and discuss how they were used for propaganda. Consider the text, the images, different icons.	Facsimiles of postcards	Small groups
25 mins	Create your own propaganda poster	Ask the pupils to create their own poster based on the death of Edith Cavell. Using an information sheet about her life.	Paper, colouring pencils, pencils Info sheet	individual
30 mins	Original documents	Look at a range of original documents relating to the First World War. Using their new skills consider how they can be used in researching the First World War.	Documents	Small groups
