## What was it like to live in Norfolk during the First World War?

**Key Stage: 2** 

Length: 2 hours

**Curriculum links: Geography, History** 

**Key Themes: WW1, Local History** 

## **Learning Objectives:**

Learn how we can use service records to find out about some of the Norfolk citizens who fought during the First World War.

- Research what happened on the home front.
- Understand what life was like on the front and the reasons for differing accounts.
