

Norfolk in World War Two

Lesson Plan-Classroom

What was it like to live in Norfolk during the Second World War?

Key Stage: 2

Type: Classroom Length: 1 ¹/₂ hours

Curriculum links: History Key Themes: WW2, Local History

Learning Objectives:

• Understand what happened to the pupils of one Norwich school which was bombed.

• Learn how everyday life changed during the war.

• Find out what happened to children who were evacuated.

• Enhance empathy skills.

5 mins	Introduction	What are we learning about today?	N/A	Whole
		How are we going to find out about		Class
		it? What is a document?		
10 mins	School bombing	Look at the photograph of St Augustine's school before and after the air raid.	ppt	Class
		Ask the pupils to work out what is happening in each of the photographs.		
		Read out the extract from the school log book of what happened when school was bombed.		
		Ask the class what they think happened to the children in the school.		
20 mins	Objects	Split the children into 6 groups. Give each group one of the artefacts (ie. Bomb, fins, bicycle lamp, ARP wardens helmet, tin of eggs, or bandage) to look at.	Objects, question sheets	Small groups

20 mins	Objects (continued)	Give each group four questions about each object to help them discover what it is. Each group to swap so they look at 2 objects each.	Objects, question sheets	Small groups
		Ask the groups to feedback to the rest of the class.		
5 mins	Cromer	Look at pictures of bombing in Cromer.	Ppt or original documents	Small groups
		Think about why children needed to leave Norfolk.		
20 mins	Evacuees arriving	Give each group five images of evacuees, along with a crib sheet containing questions.	Photographs or original documents	Small groups/ Class
		Explain these are pictures of children during the war. Ask them to think about the questions to enable them to work out who the children are.		
		Ask the groups to feedback to the rest of the class about what they discovered.		
20 mins	Evacuee letter	Give the pupils the letter from the evacuee for them to open.	Evacuee letter	Pairs/ Class
		Play the recording so they can read along at the same time.		
		Ask the pupils to think about what is happening to the evacuee and how she felt.		
30 mins	Billeting Officer (for older pupils)	Give each pair a list of evacuees who have been sent to Norfolk, a list of accommodation, and a blank table.	List of evacuees who have been sent to Norfolk, List of accommodatio n and blank table.	Pairs
		Ask them to try and match the evacuees to the accommodation by filling in the table.		
		Ask the pupils to feedback to the rest of the class, thinking about what they needed to consider, in order to place everyone successfully.		
5 mins	Evaluation	Pupils to write what they have learnt during the session on a post-it note	Post-it notes, pencils	Individual
